Harmony with Mother Earth

The General Assembly,

Expressing concern at the documented environmental degradation and the widespread changes resulting from human activity,

Recalling the 1982 World Charter for Nature,¹

Reaffirming the Rio Declaration on Environment and Development,²

Reaffirming also Agenda 21³ and the Programme for the Further Implementation of Agenda 21,⁴ the Johannesburg Declaration on Sustainable Development⁵ and the Plan of Implementation of the World Summit on Sustainable Development (“the Johannesburg Plan of Implementation”),⁶

Recalling the 2005 World Summit Outcome,⁷

Reaffirming its resolution 63/278 of 22 April 2009, on the designation of International Mother Earth Day,

Convinced that humanity can and must live in harmony with nature,

1. *Invites* Member States, the relevant organizations of the United Nations system, and international, regional and subregional organizations to transmit to the Secretary-General their views on the scope and content of a possible declaration of ethical principles and values for living in harmony with Mother Earth;
 2. *Requests* the Secretary-General to submit to it, at its sixty-fifth session, a report on the views and comments received in relation to the present resolution;
 3. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its sixty-fifth session an item entitled “Harmony with Mother Earth” for consideration by the Second Committee.
