Colombia* and China: draft resolution

Strengthening of the United Nations Environment Programme

The General Assembly,

<u>Recalling</u> its resolution 2997 (XXVII) of 15 December 1972, in which it decided to establish a Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme,

Recalling also decision 15/1, of 25 May 1989, of the Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme, in which the Council, <u>inter alia</u>, reaffirmed the central role of the United Nations Environment Programme as the central catalysing, coordinating and stimulating body in the field of environment within the United Nations system,

Recalling further decisions 16/6 and 16/1, both of 31 May 1991, of the Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme, in the latter of which the Council supported the retaining at United Nations Environment Programme headquarters in Nairobi of the programme activity centres already located there, decided that future major extensions to the physical or other infrastructure of the Programme, particularly those with global functions, be centred principally at Nairobi, and requested the Executive Director to examine the feasibility of providing on-site interpretation facilities and to continue negotiations with the host Government with a view to improving the facilities available at the headquarters office at Nairobi, including external communication services,

Reaffirming paragraph 38.21 of Agenda 21, $\underline{1}$ / in which it was stated that there would be a need for an enhanced and strengthened role for the United Nations Environment Programme and its Governing Council,

Reaffirming also paragraph 38.22 of Agenda 21, in which it was stated that priority areas on which the United Nations Environment Programme should concentrate included, inter alia, developing and promoting the use of such techniques as natural resource accounting and environmental economics, environmental monitoring and assessment, and strengthening and making operational its early warning function, further development of international environmental law, and support to Governments in the integration of environmental aspects into their development policies,

Reaffirming further paragraphs 25, 26 and 32 (c) of its resolution 47/191 of 22 December 1992,

<u>Commending</u> the United Nations Environment Programme for its leading role in the negotiation of many international conventions on environment, its mobilization of global environmental awareness, and its contribution in the area of capacity-building in regard to the preservation of the environment and its integration into sustainable development,

 $\underline{\text{Mindful}}$ of the need to rationalize environment-related meetings so as to ensure effective capacity utilization at United Nations Environment Programme headquarters,

- 1. <u>Endorses</u> the report of the Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme on the work of its seventeenth session; 2/
- 2. <u>Stresses</u> the need for close cooperation between the United Nations Environment Programme and the Commission on Sustainable Development in implementing the recommendations of the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development in accordance with the relevant provisions of chapter 38 of Agenda 21;
- 3. <u>Welcomes</u> the action-oriented approach of the Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme towards the implementation of the follow-up activities to the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development as outlined in the report mentioned in paragraph 1 above;

- 4. Expresses its gratitude to the Government of Kenya for the grant of an additional 40 acres of land for the expansion of office facilities and the improvement of the communications network so as to ensure that the United Nations Environment Programme and other United Nations organs, agencies and programmes based at Nairobi work in a conducive environment;
- 5. <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to establish a liaison office at Nairobi for the secretariat of the Commission on Sustainable Development, on the basis of arrangements made at the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development, as called for in paragraph 32 (c) of General Assembly resolution 47/191;
- 6. <u>Endorses</u> resolution 17/32 of the Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme on the Environment Fund and urges Member States to contribute to the Fund, to make their payments in advance of the year to which those payments relate and to pay their contributions early in the year in order to enable the secretariat of the United Nations Environment Programme to plan and execute programmes more effectively, and emphasizes that high priority should be given to activities that offer direct or indirect substantial support to developing countries;
- 7. <u>Notes with appreciation</u> the efforts of the Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme to ensure that more environment-related meetings are held at Programme headquarters so as to maximize utilization of conference facilities and services;
- 8. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to ensure that the programming of environment-related meetings is rationalized to facilitate economy and more effective capacity utilization at United Nations Environment Programme headquarters;
- 9. <u>Also requests</u> the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly at its forty-ninth session on the implementation of the present resolution.
