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ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT: INTERNATIONAL DECADE
FOR NATURAL DISASTER REDUCTION

Costa Rica* and Colombia**: draft resolution

International Decade for Natural Disaster Reduction

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolutions 44/236 of 22 December 1989, 48/188 of 21 December 1993, 49/22 A of 2 December 1994, 49/22 B of 20 December 1994 and 50/117 A and 50/117 B, both of 20 December 1995, and Economic and Social Council resolution 1996/45 of 26 July 1996,

Expressing its solidarity with the people and countries that suffer as a result of natural disasters and expressing also the deepest sympathy to all victims of the natural disasters that have struck in various parts of the globe,

Emphasizing once again the urgent need for concrete measures to reduce the vulnerability of societies to natural hazards, the loss of human lives and the heavy physical and economic damage that occur as a result of natural disasters, in particular in developing countries, small island States and landlocked countries,

Commending those countries, national and local institutions, organizations and associations that have adopted policies, allocated resources and initiated

action programmes, including international assistance, for disaster reduction and, in this context, welcoming the participation of private companies and individuals,

1. Takes note of the report of the Secretary-General on the International Decade for Natural Disaster Reduction; 1/

2. Reaffirms that disaster reduction is an integral part of and contributes to the achievement of sustainable development, through the protection, at the national and community levels, of such resources as human lives, human capacities, financial assets, natural assets, natural resources and the environment, means of production and infrastructure;

3. Calls upon Member States, relevant intergovernmental bodies and all others involved in the International Decade for Natural Disaster Reduction to extend financial and technical support for Decade activities, in order to ensure the implementation of the International Framework of Action for the Decade, 2/ in particular with a view to translating the Yokohama Strategy for a Safer World: Guidelines for Natural Disaster Prevention, Preparedness and Mitigation and the Plan of Action contained therein 3/ into concrete disaster reduction programmes and activities;

4. Commends all countries that have mobilized domestic resources for disaster reduction activities and facilitated the effective implementation of such activities, and encourages all countries concerned to continue in this direction;

5. Reaffirms the need to support the implementation of the Yokohama Strategy and its Plan of Action with particular regard to improving education and training in disaster reduction, including the creation of interdisciplinary and technical networking at all levels, for the purpose of capacity-building and human resources development in developing countries, in particular those that are prone to natural disasters, as well as least developed, small island and landlocked countries;

6. Stresses the need for synergy between the implementation of the Programme of Action for the Sustainable Development of Small Island Developing States 4/ and that of the Yokohama Strategy and its Plan of Action as they relate to natural disaster reduction;

7. Underlines the need for the United Nations system to ensure the integration of the Yokohama Strategy and its Plan of Action into the coordinated approach taken to the follow-up to all recent major United Nations conferences and summit meetings and to the implementation of their respective plans of action;

8. Invites the Secretary-General, in particular, to facilitate, within the existing International Framework of Action for the Decade, an internationally concerted framework for improvements in early warning capacities by developing a concrete proposal for an effective international mechanism on early warning, to include the transfer of technologies related to early warning to developing countries, under the auspices of the United Nations and as part of the implementation of the International Framework of Action for the Decade and the Yokohama Strategy and its Plan of Action;

9. Calls on the Secretary-General to ensure adequate consideration and involvement of the International Framework of Action for the Decade in the evaluation and overall review and appraisal of the implementation of Agenda 21 5/ in 1997;

10. Reaffirms that the secretariat of the Decade will continue to serve as the substantive secretariat for the preparation of the closing event of the Decade, working with the full support of relevant bodies of the United Nations Secretariat and drawing on the contributions of the organizations of the United Nations system concerned, other international organizations and Governments;

11. Requests the Secretary-General to ensure the availability of resources for the activities related to the preparation of the closing event of the Decade and to appeal for additional voluntary contributions to the Trust Fund for the Decade;

12. Also requests the Secretary-General to review relationships and responsibilities for natural disaster reduction with respect to the future, and to submit to the General Assembly at its fifty-second session, through the Economic and Social Council, a report on the implementation of the International Framework of Action for the Decade, including concrete proposals for ensuring the distinct performance capability of the secretariat of the Decade, in order to bring the Decade to its successful conclusion by the year 1999;

13. Requests the secretariat of the Decade to convene, in its capacity as substantive secretariat of the closing event of the Decade, the first meeting of the preparatory committee for the closing event, not later than the special session of the General Assembly to review Agenda 21, and with due recognition of equitable regional representation.
